

Spring Cleaning Your Vehicle

ur vehicles operate in a harsh environment that affects various automotive components. Vehicles have been exposed to slushy, salt-laden snow attacking every area imaginable. This article addresses some of the things that need attention this spring.

Clean the road grime build-up from the backs of your wheels: Dirt accumulation can cause wheel imbalance setting off severe vibrations that can accelerate wear of tires, steering and suspension components. Also with today's aluminum alloy rims, road salt corrodes rims faster than oxygen. This would be a perfect time to have your tires filled with nitrogen, which has been proven to greatly reduce corrosion of the bead areas on aluminum wheels.

Check your braking system to be sure it is in top condition. Rust and corrosion can impede braking performance but they happen so gradually we do not notice it.

Service your vehicles battery and inspect all wiring. This is an excellent time to have your battery terminals

cleaned to remove corrosion build up. And while under the hood inspect all wiring. A single loose or dirty connection can leave you stranded as the wiring harnesses are essential pathways for the on-board computer to receive data from all its many sensors.

Internally, gum and carbon can begin



to contaminate essential engine systems (fuel rail, fuel injectors, intake air plenum runners, valves, combustion chambers and the EGR system to name a few). You can restore the health of these systems by performing a fuel system service. The benefits will be instantaneous. You'll have more power, easier starts, improved pick up/ take off response and better fuel economy. The environment will also benefit as you'll have lower tail pipe emissions.

Another spring clean up that may be required is servicing the throttle body and the hot wire grid in the mass air flow sensor. Periodic cleaning keeps your vehicle performing well while giving you the best fuel economy.

And when all that's done, replace your air filter and cabin air filters (if so equipped): Filters should be replaced every 20,000 km or once a year. There's no time like spring to get the benefit of the fresh air.

With today's vehicles, it's easy to ignore regular maintenance schedules. The complex computer systems used to operate late model vehicles have an uncanny ability to hide minor problems, which not only rob your vehicle of fuel and power, but can lead to larger issues if ignored too long. Your best chance for years of trouble-free driving is maintain your vehicle according to the manufacturer's guideline at the mileage intervals recommended.





A Recipe For Pet Food Part 3: Ingredients And Nutrients Continued

ast month we talked about protein (meat) ingredients in pet food and where they often come from. This month we'll continue our discussions on other ingredients and the nutrients they provide.

Grains such as corn, oats and wheat provide carbohydrates the pet can burn for energy, fats and sometimes essential amino acids (small bits of the stuff that makes protein). Sometimes special fibre sources for intestinal health (such as beet pulp) or special ingredients such as flax seed are added for the specialized nutrients they can provide. A list of vitamins and minerals then follows on the ingredient list. Some manufacturers simply list the words 'vitamins and minerals' on the bag while others spell out specifically which ones are included. Do not be turned off by a list of what looks to you like chemical soup! For example 'pyridoxine hydrochloride' is just another name for vitamin B6. Preservatives are also listed on the ingredient list. Many people have issues with preservatives in food

so many pet food companies are moving away from using synthetic ones like BHT and ethoxyquin, and are using naturally occurring ones liked mixed tocopherols and rosemary extract instead. Preservatives are essential to prevent the pet food from spoiling or degrading before the pet gets to eat it.

Whatever ingredients are used in the food, remember one thing: they must be digested in the body, breaking them into their smallest component pieces (nutrients) to be used. Assuring yourself of the nutritional adequacy of the food you purchase for your pet once again becomes a very important consideration (see our March Booster article for ideas on how to do this).

Many people tell me they have concerns with certain ingredients being listed on pet food labels because of food allergies. It is true that some pets have allergies to specific food ingredients just like people do. It is important to remember that allergic reactions are specific to an individual and just because one pet might react to a particular ingredient, it does not mean that all pets will. Pet food companies include specific ingredients in their foods for the nutrients they can provide. If your pet requires a special diet because of medical concerns, such as allergies, you should consult your veterinarian for a list of foods containing ingredients appropriate for your particular pet.



The ABC's of Homeopathy

et's get down to basics. What remedies do you need to have on hand in an emergency? The ABC's of Homeopathy are:

Aconite is great for the fear and restlessness that result from a shock or trauma. But Aconite can be used to prevent fear too. If your child - or husband!! - is afraid to go to the dentist from fear of the pain, try giving him/her a dose of Aconite 30C the night before and the morning of the appointment. If you continue this approach with each appointment for a while, you will find the fear lessens to the point that the remedy is no longer needed.

<u>**Belladonna 6C**</u> is a must for any parent. Infants can spike a fever very suddenly. Instead of reaching for children's

tylenol, try some homeopathic Belladonna instead. It will allow the body to maintain a reasonable fever, which is important for eradicating a virus, but it will ensure that the fever doesn't reach dangerous levels. Belladonna is a remedy for treating convulsions, so it also helps to prevent the convulsions that can occur when a fever is too high.

Chamomilla is so well known for in-

fant teething problems that people forget it can be used for older children or even adults. The typical Chamomilla child is absolutely miserable from the pain of teething and can't be comforted. No matter what you try, it doesn't help. The pain is just too intense. When I was a pig farmer, I had a sow who was in so much pain giving birth to her piglets that she began savaging them - a dose of Chamomilla calmed her down and helped her deal with the pain.

There are many other remedies you'll want to have in your first aid kit, but start with just a few until you get to know them well. Here's a few others you can check out:

<u>Arnica</u> - for any injury, and especially to prevent or treat bruises

<u>Arsenicum</u> - for stomach flu or food poisoning with vomiting and diarrhea

Calendula cream - to prevent infection of wounds

<u>Cantharis</u> - for pain from burns with blisters

<u>*Hepar-sulph*</u> - for any kind of infection, including toothaches

<u>Ledum</u> - for any puncture wound including dog bites and insect stings

<u>Ruta</u> - for any inflammation, but especially for sprains, strains and tennis elbow



Canada Pension Plan Changes

There have been a number of changes announced in respect of the Canada Pension Plan (CPP), some of which are effective at the start of the year and others that are either effective in 2012 or will be phased in starting in 2012.

As of January 2011, your monthly CPP retirement pension was increased by a larger percentage if taken after age 65. Before the change the increase was 0.5% for each month after age 65 (up to age 70) that you delayed receiving it. For 2011 the increase per month will be 0.57%, in 2012 the increase will be 0.64% and it tops out at 0.70% in 2013. So in the future someone waiting until age 70 could receive 42% more than they would have at age 65.

Starting in 2012 taking CPP early will cost you more. Currently you can start as early as age 60 and the reduction is 0.5% per month for a maximum reduction of 30%. In 2012 the monthly reduction will be 0.52%, 0.54% in 2012, 0.56% in 2013 and so on until it tops out at 0.60% in 2016. Once fully phased in taking CPP

pension at age 60 will result in a reduction of 36% of your normal pension.

Also starting in 2012 the number of years of low or zero earnings that are automatically dropped from the calculation will increase and you will be able to start receiving CPP without any work interruption.

Perhaps the biggest change also starting in 2012 is that if you are under 65 and you work while receiving your CPP retirement pension then you and your employer will have to continue to make CPP contributions. These extra contributions will increase your CPP retirement benefits but it also increases the cost of taking CPP early if your plan is to continue working.

The CPP death benefit remains at a maximum \$2500 so anyone within 10 years of age 60 who has the flexibility of avoiding CPP (ie. an incorporated business owner) should look at the cost and benefits of continuing to contribute, especially when they are paying both the employee and employer portion of the CPP.

ne of the best ways to stay in shape and keep the weight off during the spring and summer is going for an evening walk. If ten to twenty minutes into the walk, pain is experienced in the lower limb we may head right back home and cut the walk short. We may experience foot pain in the heel (fasciitis) or ball of the foot, shin splints, knee pain or hip pain.

The average person walks, depending on activity levels up to 15000 steps a day! At heel strike, forces greater then the weight of the body are transferred throughout the bone structure of the lower limb. After heel strike a complex series of movements occur to allow us to walk. If pain occurs
